Generally, a heavy equipment operator is required to be certified by regional or local agencies. Some are cross-trained and certified to operate a lot of different machine types. Other operators choose to specialize in operating just one kind of machinery and only need periodic updates on their operating permit certifications.

Workers in this business are often trained through a formal apprenticeship program provided by unions or companies or else with on-the-job training. Some technical and trade schools offer paid training courses. It is essential that employers hire fully-trained heavy equipment operators to be able to adhere to local guidelines and comply with local and regional laws regarding job conditions and worker safety.
